

The Medwin Prize in Acoustical Oceanography was established in 2001 to recognize a person for the effective use of sound in the discovery and understanding of physical and biological parameters and processes in the sea.

The 2013 recipient is Philippe Roux

Philippe Roux is Research Director at the Institute of Earth Sciences at Grenoble University in Grenoble, France.

He received his Ph.D. degree from the University of Paris and his publications include over 100 peer-reviewed papers.

Philippe Roux is an experimentalist with a strong background in ultrasonics, underwater acoustics and geophysics. His research topics are centered on underwater acoustics and geophysics, the link between the two being his expertise in wave propagation in complex media. He presented the Acoustical Oceanography Prize Lecture, "Acoustical tomography in the shallow water ocean: Dream or reality?," earlier today.
